Cathedral Center (was Mthr Teresa Ctr) This center is housed in the former convent at St. John's Cathedral in Milwaukee. It is a women's shelter, but has rooms for families as well. They also provide food, transportation, healthcare, counseling, financial support and spirituality. Their goal is to empower and enable the women to face the world once again. Sojourner Family Peace Center Milwaukee's oldest and largest shelter for battered men, women and children. Provides temporary shelter and counseling in helping to restore their dignity and self-worth.	Empowerment, Direct Service	Local	\$800
