John E. Sandstrom Award

To commemorate the John E. Sandstrom standard of excellence set forth at St. John Vianney grade school, an annual award and \$1000 scholarship will be presented to the graduating eighth grade athlete that best demonstrated excellence in attitude, leadership, work ethic, athletic participation, and athletic achievement. The winner of this award is the type of person that John Sandstrom would have selected as captain of his own team.

In determining who shall receive the John E. Sandstrom Memorial Scholarship Award, the following criteria should be considered.

Leadership: Being a team leader, the type of person that the other players respect is an important consideration in the selection process. The athlete should lead by example and possess the qualities of a team captain.

Work Ethic: The nominee should display the work ethic of a true competitor. The individual should give one hundred percent in practice and in games. Showing dedication, by training and practicing outside of normal practice times should also be considered.

Participation & Achievement: Athletic success and overall team participation need to be considered. This athlete should excel in multiple sports at St. John Vianney School.
